North Pine Dam Improvement Project

We're making our largest investment in our dams to keep water safe and reliable for everyone in South East Queensland. As part of this initiative, the North Pine Dam Improvement and Staged Strengthening Project is being carried out to bring the dam up to modern engineering standards, ensuring it continues to provide water security for generations to come.


We acknowledge such a significant project may cause disruptions, and we appreciate the community's patience and understanding as we work together to enhance our region's water infrastructure.

North Pine Dam Staged Strengthening Project

The North Pine Dam Staged Strengthening Project has reached a major milestone, with the construction contract awarded to SRG Global Civil Pty Ltd. This marks a key step toward delivering vital dam safety upgrades, with mobilisation scheduled for the coming months and major works from late 2025.

Seqwater and SRG Global Civil Pty Ltd will work closely together to finalise the construction methodology, develop the project delivery schedule, and prepare the site. Site preparation work will include installation of project fencing, minor clearing of trees and vegetation, establishment of erosion and sediment controls, construction of site facilities, survey works, mobilisation of equipment and materials, and other pre-construction tasks.

The project team will ensure only the minimum area of vegetation is cleared to enable the project to proceed safely. Terrestrial fauna will be managed by suitably qualified environmental specialists operating under the appropriate permits. Both Seqwater and SRG Global Civil Pty Ltd are committed to the responsible management of the environment. The project team will continue to comply with the relevant legislation and environmental requirements.



PROGRESS UPDATE

North Pine Dam Improvement Project

The Options Analysis for the North Pine Dam Improvement Project was completed in early 2025. The Options Analysis confirmed the preferred design option will include raising the dam wall, raising the saddle dams, and upgrading the spillway and gates.

The project has moved into the next planning phase, with a Detailed Business Case now underway. This phase focuses on creating a clear plan to upgrade the dam so it can continue operating safely and support long-term water security.

As part of this work, we're assessing the project against key goals, regulations, and costs to make sure we deliver a safe, effective, and value-for-money solution for the community.
